Dear Parents/Caregivers

Miss Cikoja conducts diagnostic assessments on students who are new to BSSS and on any child who has been identified by their teacher as having difficulties with their literacy and/or numeracy. Miss Cikoja also conducts assessments which help identify gifted and talented students throughout the school.

Miss Cikoja implements and coordinates an assortment of reading programs and interventions throughout the school for ESL students and students who need extra support with their reading. She also teaches spelling to the lower school throughout the year.

Miss Cikoja organises and oversees the implementation of the National Assessment Program –Literacy and Numeracy (NAPLAN) at BSSS and would be happy to answer your questions surrounding this if you have any. Watch this space for information on NAPLAN 2017 coming soon!!!!

Miss Cikoja is also a Case Manager for Individual Curriculum Plans (ICPs) for students who are working well above year level standards or well below year level standards.

Heat and Bats

With the current excessive heat conditions, Queensland Health has advised that there is likely to be an increased risk of exposure to Australian bat lyssavirus (ABLV). This is because heat-stressed bats will drop their young as a survival strategy, and when the bats are on the ground, it is possible that children may handle them, and be bitten or scratched.

ABLV can cause serious illness and there have been deaths as a result of ABLV infection, so a timely reminder to everyone **not to touch bats**.

With the warm weather, snakes are extremely active. Please remind your children to walk away and leave them alone if they see one.

2017 Payment Methods and Forms

Starting this year, there will not be an area on excursion forms to be able to write down your credit card details for payment. Parents are encouraged to pay for excursions/school fees via Bpoint and internet banking. Payment methods in order of preference are:

1. Bpoint (invoice will be emailed)
2. Internet banking (pamphlets available from office)
3. In person by Debit/Credit card - Tuesdays and Thursdays between 8-10am.
4. In person by cash - Tuesdays and Thursdays between 8-10am. When sending money to the office, please ensure it is in a ziplock bag or envelope.

Regardless of payment method, please also send in the students permission note.

BPoint

BPoint is an online payment system and can be accessed via ANY Computer or Smart Phone. Payments are accepted via Mastercard or VISA and is a secured payment method.

Parents can log into: www.bpoint.com.au/payments/dete once you have logged in you will need the information from the school invoice to complete the BPoint payment page. Invoices are sent home for each fee payable including incursions/excursions.

Internet Banking

Each student has a unique student number which identifies your child and must be used for each transaction. We also ask you to note that each excursion activity or Levy note also has a unique code which will identify the activity you wish to pay for within the excursion/levy letter. Please use this code along with the unique student number in the description area when making payments to the school.
